

Challenge

Previously at ALM, the staff had to walk to shared fax machine stations that were scattered throughout the building, often having to wait in line. Not only was the existing process extremely inefficient and frustrating, but with a volume of 30,000 outbound faxes each month, it was clearly unacceptable.



"Our fax process was extremely slow. Every time someone wanted to send a fax, they had to leave their workstation, go the fax machine, and then wait for their turn," remarked Julius Chan, Senior PC Systems Analyst at ALM. "Not only did we need to address this time consuming process, but we also wanted to reduce paper usage, storage space and other associated costs of the traditional manual faxing process."

Solution

Chan determined ALM needed an easy-to-install, flexible fax application that would increase productivity while decreasing their costs. He researched the possibilities and came up with the answer: a NET SatisFAXtion Enterprise Edition fax server with 16 ports, API, email and broadcast capabilities.

"I researched and tested other products, but NET SatisFAXtion stood out in terms of its flexibility," said Chan. "Other companies were limited in their fax hardware options but NET SatisFAXtion didn't have those same restrictions. We also got the performance, reliability and security we needed – at a cost that was affordable."
